## CHOOSING AND DOWNLOADING IMAGES

**GOAL** Saving and Presenting Primary Sources Time Required **OBJECTIVES** Participants will: Distinguish between the various image formats. Execute the process of downloading images from a website. Standards **MATERIALS** Materials/Resources Using Primary Sources in the Classroom Computer with Internet access Projector and screen **PREPARATION** Ensure that you can access the Library of Congress website at http://www.loc.gov/. Test all of the links below.

### PROCEDURE Digital Image Formats

Most images of maps, text/pages, photos, and other images are either GIF or JPEG formats. No special plug-ins or media players are necessary to view either of these formats. Occasionally, some images (such as maps) are also offered in a high-quality TIFF format that is more suitable for printing. TIFF files are much larger in size and require a special viewer or image software to view. Use the following steps to download an image file.

- 1. Open the Library of Congress website: http://www.loc.gov/.
- Click on the American Memory tab on the LOC home page and click the GO button or click on the following link: <a href="http://memory.loc.gov/">http://memory.loc.gov/</a>.
- 3. Select the *Browse* button.
- 4. Choose Photos, Prints under Browse Collections Containing.
- 5. Click on Baseball Cards ~ 1887-1914.
- 6. Next to Browse by, select the Player option.
- 7. Select *Brashear*, *R to Connor*, *Roger*, the second option in the list.
- 8. Scroll down and select Cobb, Ty.
- 9. Choose the first option for [Ty Cobb].
- 10. Click on the thumbnail for either the front or back of the baseball card to access the larger .jpeg version.
- 11. Notice the option to access the high resolution uncompressed TIFF version. This would be useful for printing the image to a larger format.

# **CHOOSING AND DOWNLOADING IMAGES**

- o Why use the small GIF file?
  - Thumbnail image in a document
  - Icon that hyperlinks to the bibliographic page at American Memory
- o Why use the full size JPEG?
  - Image size printing (not for enlargements)
  - Import into PowerPoint slides
- 12. Right-click on the image.
- 13. Choose the Save target as... or the Save link as... option.
- 14. In the *File Name* text box, rename the image file to something meaningful (ie. "Cobb\_Card\_Front").
- 15. In the *Save In* dropdown box, select where you want to save the file (for this lesson save the file to the Desktop).
- 16. Click *Save*. (Realize that the same steps can be taken to download the small thumbnail image (.gif) and the larger printable image (.tiff). You have access to three different sizes).
- 17. Locate the image file on your desktop and double-click it to view.
